

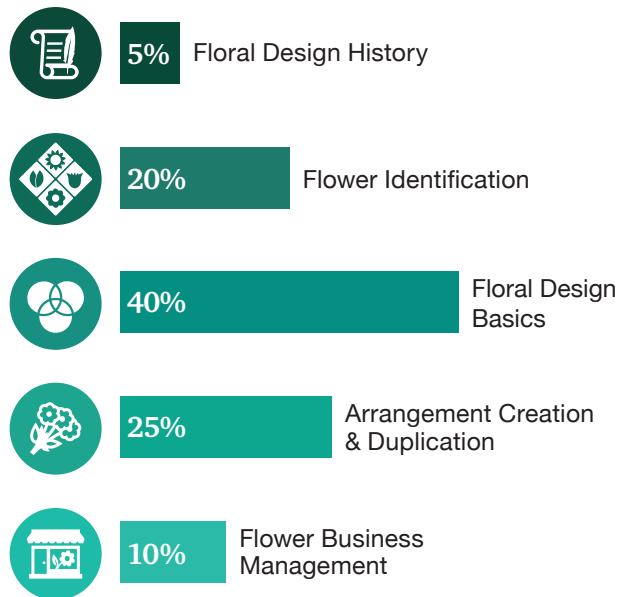


PRINCIPLES OF FLORAL DESIGN CERTIFICATION

Elements & Principles

(line, form, space, texture, pattern, color, size, fragrance, balance, proportion, scale, harmony, unity, dominance, focal point, emphasis, accent, rhythm, depth, repetition, transition, contrast, variation, opposition, tension)

Color

Design Techniques

(types of flowers, floral foam, floral wire)

Wiring Methods

(straight, piercing, cross-piercing, bracing, wrap-around extension, hairpin, feathering)

Design Creation

(triangular, circular, crescent arrangements)

Post Harvest Care of Flowers

(storage, stem treatments, preservatives)

Arrangement Creation & Duplication

(Tool/Supply Identification, Design Plan, Flower/Foliage Choice, Construction, Critique/Evaluation)

Corsage & Boutonniere

(single bloom corsage, multi-bloom corsage, wrist corsage, clutch corsage, specialty corsage, single bloom boutonniere, multi-bloom boutonniere, alternative boutonniere)

Wedding Arrangements

(bridal bouquet, boutonniere, bridesmaid bouquet, flower girl arrangement, corsage, unity candle arrangement, pew markers, center pieces)

Special Arrangements

(Valentine's Day arrangement, Easter arrangements, Administrative Professional's Day arrangement, Mother's Day arrangement, Fall arrangements)

Bereavement Arrangements

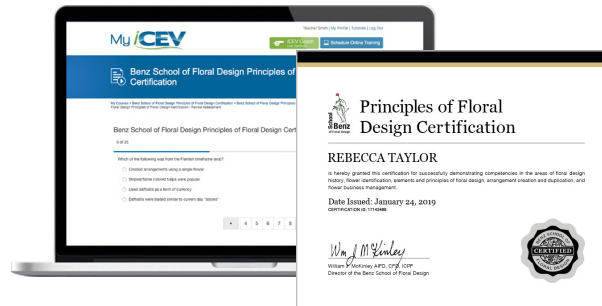
(sympathy tributes, standing spray, casket spray, potted plant, vase arrangement, memorial arrangement)
